CCoA is an independent unit of state government, designated as the state's principal advocate for older adults. CCoA's reach is broad, comprehensive and dynamic. Much of the work centers on public policy and advocacy as well as education. CCoA frequently collaborates with other organizations to promote and discuss the needs of California's aging population.

CCoA priorities include issues related to physical and mental health, women's rights, poverty, elder justice, long-term services and supports, longevity and caregiving.

Established in 1973 by a California government mandate and confirmed in the Older Californians Act, CCoA is comprised of 25 commissioners – representing diverse fields related to aging. Commissioners serve three-year terms as volunteers and are appointed by the Governor, the Speaker of the Assembly or the Senate Rules Committee.
