CA Commission on Aging Convenes for General Meeting in Sacramento

Three CCoA Sponsored Bills will be Discussed

SACRAMENTO --- The California Commission on Aging (CCoA) is convening for a General Meeting in Sacramento March 14 and 15 for a series of events to further the Commission's policy priorities and support new legislation to benefit older Californians.

Tuesday, March 14, from 1:00 to 5:00 pm, the CCoA will host a hybrid meeting at their offices at 2880 Gateway Oaks Dr., Suite 390, Sacramento, CA 95833. The Commissioners will discuss the three legislative bills sponsored by the CCoA this term: AB 770 (Kalra); AB 820 (Reyes); SB 544 (Laird) Historical Property Contracts. Reports will be presented by the Executive, Legislative, and Federal Advocacy Committees. The event will include a presentation by Dustin Plotkin, FSA, MAAA, ACIA, Principal, Oliver Wyman, titled *AB 567 Feasibility Report Overview*. Commissioners will walk the halls and meet with legislators on Wednesday, March 15, 2023.
