- Organized service providers and senior clientele to advocate for protection of aging programs and against draconian cuts and devastating eliminations
- Thousands of calls, faxes and letters flooded Sacramento
- Exerted pressure to pass budget and get OAA federal funds flowing to AAAs; prevent facility closures and service gaps

Service providers & seniors in action!


- Successfully opposed and facilitated defeat of DOA/RAP consolidation proposal

- Influenced Council vote in favor of making bridge loan to LADOA to compensate for OAA funding freeze from state budget impasse


- The days of simply "Advocating"; pushing legislators to pass legislation is passé.
- Today, and every day hereafter, it is not just a struggle for new legislation... **BUT** it is a fight to preserve, to maintain, to strengthen, to find new partners!


DISMANTLING OF THE AGING SERVICES NETWORK


